OADDP has 982 members from 125 OEA locals (152 members from 97 local school board locals).

OADDP is dedicated to improving the education and habilitation of persons with DD and being the voice for the staff who work with them. Previously the concentration was on consumers and staff at County Boards of DD. Now OADDP seeks to involve more OEA members working in Local School Districts. OADDP strives to provide valuable information to all OEA members working with children and adults with DD.
