## DISTURBING NEWS: THE PORTAGE COUNTY BOARD OF DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES <u>PLANNED</u> TO PUT ITS SERVICE & SUPPORT ADMINISTRATORS OUT ON STRIKE!

Late Thursday, Portage Co SSAs learned from newly-released Board documents the DD Board HAS BEEN PLANNING THIS STRIKE SINCE JUNE 23! This is nearly *3 MONTHS BEFORE* the SSAs took a strike vote & only the day after the 2nd mediation session!!

The Timeline:

- 1. August 31, 2016: The SSA's Contract expires & "negotiations" start on Sept. 28.
- 2. January 4, 2017: The Board demands mediation.
- 3. March 30: First mediation session held. Board leaves after only 25 minutes.
- 4. **June 22**: 2<sup>nd</sup> mediation session held. The Board leaves less than 2 hours after the session started. Additional mediation dates set for August.
- 5. **June 23**: The Board is already emailing with Michigan-based Huffmaster about strike "security" and replacement workers! AT THIS TIME, THERE WAS NO TALK OR INTENT OF A STRIKE FROM THE SSAs.
- 6. **July/August**: Board coordinates with Huffmaster to orchestrate a strike. Meanwhile, the SSAs patiently wait for the next mediation date in hopes of reaching an agreement.
- 7. August 28: 3<sup>rd</sup> mediation session held. Board's team leaves after 3 hours, illegally claiming they "didn't have the authority to bargain or consider the Association's proposals." Board cancels August 30 session.
- 8. **September 11**: Board issues "last, best offer" knowing it does NOT address SSA concerns, trying to force the SSAs to accept 13 years without a cost-of-living adjustment.
- 9. **September 14**: With no choice, SSAs vote to issue a 10-day strike notice, hoping the Board will have a change of heart & come back to the table.
- 10. **October 4**: Refusing to come back to the table, the Board forces its pre-orchestrated strike.

It's clear the **DD Board WANTED this strike**, rather than continuing to serve the **685** citizens with developmental disabilities of Portage County?

The Portage County Commissioners & Probate Judge Berger APPOINT & CAN DISMISS the DD Board members. Contact them <u>today</u> to demand that they direct the Board to go back to the table & bargain fairly with the SSAs! They have the authority to do it and are elected by all of us to work for & protect the rights & needs of the citizens of Portage County!

- Despite multiple offers by our SSAs & an 8-day strike, the Portage Board of DD <u>REFUSES</u> to come back to the table to negotiate a Fair Contract.
- The Board would rather continue paying out-of-state "security" agents & Board attorney Ron Habowski tens of thousands of dollars rather than use that money to settle the contract & support the citizens they *claim* to care for.
- > The Board has a <u>budget carryover</u> of nearly \$20 million!
