What is it?

- Formerly called the Fund for Children and Public Education (FCPE)
- OEAs Political Action Fund (PAC)
- NOT DUES DOLLARS!
- Voluntary Contributions from members for political purposes.



How OEA Advocates

- Lobbying Government Relations (GR)/UPACs in OME Dept.
- CMS -- County Boards making direct care plans creates conflict of interest
- 2021 -- HB 166 Increased the state minimum teacher salary from \$20,000 to \$30,000
- 2022 -- HB 110
 - Pathway out of State control for Youngstown, Lorain and E. Cleveland School Districts
 - Fair School Funding Formula
 - Requires the State of Ohio to fund vouchers and charters, protects local school district funds
- 2022 HB 322, 327, 616
 - Defeated Education Censorship Bills
- 2022 HJR 6
 - Process for citizens to change the Ohio Constitution

- OEA Fund endorses and donates money to pro-public education candidates
- The State Council is elected from the membership and drafts screening questions.
- Every local education association has at least 1 representative on the screening committees for their legislative districts to endorse and/or give money to candidates from the OEA Fund.
